Both centres were decorated and formally inaugurated by children attending the respective centres with a ribbon cutting ceremony followed by distribution of sweets.

# Relief for Vardah cyclone affected families:

Many slum houses and families in Chennai were affected by the Vardah cyclone especially some of the houses near our Kotturpuram after-school centre. When we talked to the affected people, we realized the main damage was to the roofs and they asked if we could provide Tarpaulin sheets as a temporary solution till they could fix the roofs.

AID INDIA had procured these as part of their relief efforts across the city and we thank them for supporting us. We first surveyed the affected houses and then distributed the materials in a respectful and organized manner at Chitra Nagar, Kotturpuram with the help of our volunteers.
