Greetings from Chudar!




In this newsletter, we are excited to share the learning progress of students at our after-school centers. Unlike government exams which test whether students can memorize their textbook, at Chudar we periodically track concepts and skills that children have learned.

The charts below show the skill levels in English and Mathematics for std 6-8 children in July and October. The maths assessment included basic arithmetic skills along with middle-school skills. We are excited to note the significant progress in skill levels across our 5 centers, which together reach 161 children. We hope to keep improving and ensure that all children can learn all these skills!
