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ABOUT CHUDAR

Chudar, founded by Dr. Ravishankar and his dedicated team, aims to enhance the quality of education for children from underprivileged backgrounds. Our mission is to ensure that every child graduates high school equipped with the necessary knowledge, skills, and confidence to succeed in their future endeavours. **"Chudar" is a Tamil word that signifies the brilliance or sparkle of a flame**, symbolising our hope that each child will shine brightly in their own unique way through our efforts.

THE PROBLEM:

Several studies show that most kids are enrolled in school but learn very little. The ASER survey points out that of all children in the age group 6-14, more than 99% are enrolled, but the majority lags behind in educational outcomes. This problem persists from primary all the way to high school and the National Achievement survey by NCERT has also shown that children have very low competencies in Mathematics, English, and Scie nce. The affects children from problem disadvantaged sections, who are often first-generation learners. The main **REASON** for low learning levels in TAMIL NADU is the prevalence of rote learning.



THE SOLUTION:

Chudar envisions that every child acquires the knowledge, skills, and confidence to face the future. We develop innovative educational content in Mathematics, Science, and English, with a focus on Classes 6 to 8. This content helps children assimilate skills and concepts as opposed to rote learning. When children truly understand instead of memorising, they become confident learners. Some of the principles of our solution are:

- Measuring learning outcomes rather than just inputs
- Prioritising skills over memorization
- Integrating technology-aided learning where feasible
- Encouraging local ownership and community participation

Through these methods, we aim to transform students into confident learners who are well-prepared for the future.

SANITATION KIT

540+ Masks Distributed



During the COVID-19 pandemic, Chudar contributed to public health by **distributing masks** to families in need. Additionally, we provided crucial support to **government hospitals** in Chennai, Thiruvannamalai. We ensured that these hospitals received an adequate supply of **three-layer masks and N95 masks to protect frontline workers and patients**. This initiative was part of our efforts to mitigate the impact of the pandemic and support vulnerable communities by ensuring access to essential protective gear.



Helped 4000 people to get vaccinated

We also supported COVID-19 vaccination efforts by printing and distributing **2,000** vaccination tokens to families for the government hospital in Chennai, Thiruvannamalai. Additionally, we provided a **10 litre supply of sanitizer** to ensure proper hygiene. In a further effort, we submitted another **2,000 vaccination tokens** to the Medical Office at Kommananthal Government Hospital in Chetpet, Chennai.

100+ Face shields, Bedspreads, oximeters and sanitizers

We distributing essential items to many families affected by COVID-19. We provided face shields, disposable bedspreads, oximeters, and sanitizers, which were vital in maintaining safety and health standards. Our efforts ensured that families had access to necessary protective gear and medical supplies, helping to prevent the spread of the virus and manage its impact. We were able to alleviate some of the hardships faced by these vulnerable families.



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RELIEF KIT

1145+ Families

Our relief efforts targeted severely impacted villages in rural Tamil Nadu, providing **grocery kits with essential supplies to vulnerable families**, including single-parent, underprivileged, tribal, daily wage earners, differently-abled, and COVID-affected families. These meticulously planned initiatives ensured timely support, with volunteers delivering supplies door-to-door while adhering to safety protocols to prevent virus spread. The relief efforts, driven by our after-school center tutors and volunteers, played a crucia role in helping these families sustain through this global health crisis.



COVID-19 AWARENESS

We launched a comprehensive campaign to educate and protect our community. We began with Zoom meetings for our after-school centre Tutors, led by **Dr. Sruthi Priyadarsini.** She covered the importance of vaccines, recognizing COVID-19 symptoms, treatment options, and the effectiveness of various masks, including double masking.



To raise public awareness, **we produced an informative video** on the coronavirus and conducted door-to-door campaigns, **reaching 30 families in Mandaveli and Kotturpuram in Chennai.** Additionally, we organized a campaign in Mandaveli to teach proper mask-wearing techniques

VACCINATION INITIATIVE

A significant part of our initiative was a vaccination camp in Arasampattu village, Tiruvannamalai where we facilitated the administration of 100 Covishield vaccines to residents. To further promote vaccination, pamphlets emphasizing its importance were distributed to various places in Tiruvannamalai. We also organised a camp and conducted swab test to test for the COVID-19 virus.


